Two of the entrances off Rt. 903 will be upgraded and they are Hawthorne Drive and Cub Lane. A section on Indian Trail from Piney Woods to the (Fork) will be overlaid. (say 600 LF) The area around the mailboxes at Behrens Rd. and Cottonwood will be paved along with about 200 LF of shoulder upgrade on Cottonwood. Adjustments to the paving on Ash Dr. coming off Behrens Rd. up to and including Mountain View are planned for paving. Enjoy the remaining seasons before the winter.

Permit applications are available on the website and at the BCL Office

Costs: Disregarding permit rules may result in surcharges of \$250. There is a \$300 fine for litter, abandoned vehicles, and overgrown vegetation.

WARNING - ELECTROSHOCK DROWNING

We all know electricity and water don't mix. I have recently learned that miniscule amounts of leaking AC current near docks can and has resulted in fresh water electroshock drowning's. All electrical circuits anywhere near the water must be protected with a Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter (GFCI). We have many newer metal docks and many boats with battery chargers and other dock lights and wiring. GFCIs also must be tested monthly. Even a temporary extension cord can cause problems. Please make sure all dock wiring and battery chargers are properly connected. If you are swimming near a dock and you feel a tingle, immediately swim away and approach from dry land. Shut off all power. Many of these accidents have involved children swimming near docks and docked boats. Let's make sure our lake is safe from this hazard. UPDATE ON THE PFT RECREATION PARK

The Penn Forest Township (PFT) Recreation Park that is being developed across Route 903 is well under construction. As we all know, this project has been years in the making since the Jim Thorpe Area School District entered into an agreement with Penn Forest Township to develop this land into a Township Park. As I write this article, the widening of the highway for the entrances has begun.

The Board of Directors has hired a consulting engineer, Whittemore and Haigh Engineering Inc., to review the land development plan to ensure that all of the components of the plan have no adverse effect on our community resources and personal property. At the July Penn Forest Township Board of Supervisors monthly meeting, the Board of Supervisors had received a detailed report from their engineers (Barry Isett and Associates) that explained the costs associated with the entire plan. The result seems to be that the BOS are taking a conservative approach at the development phases – the plan, which initially was thought to be fully funded with state grant money, will now end up costing the Township \$900,000.00 +/-.

The BCLCA Board of Directors, along with Whittemore and Haigh Engineering Inc., will continue to be steadfast in our monitoring of this development. There are some initial concerns with the Hydrology, Design and Post Storm Water Management that we are meeting with Township engineers to discuss. We hope to resolve these issues before any major development begins.

LIFEGUARD COMMITTEE

What a summer it has been so far. We are half way through July and have had some really great weather. Through July 15th we have had 2 in-service training sessions with a certified instructor. She has reported that our lifeguards are all performing up to standards. We have 2 more sessions scheduled for this year, and I'm confident that our lifeguards will continue to do well. Pool Day is coming up and is always one of the highlights of the season. As of this writing, lifeguard challenge and lifeguard appreciation night at the pool are still on the schedule.

Last week the lifeguards played the Past Our Prime (POP) wiffle ball team in a 14 inning game that ended in a 3-3 tie. Neither team wanted the game to end. Afterwards the POP team treated the lifeguards to hot dogs and drinks. Both sides really enjoyed the experience and another game is being planned.

As of July 15th the lifeguards have made 2 water rescues at the pool and 1 at the lake. Their diligence to duty and quick reaction prevented the incidents from becoming more serious than they already were. Just a reminder, when the lifeguards respond to a situation in the water, they are required to complete an incident report immediately. This will necessitate getting everyone out of the water while they complete their report. Once again this year, the lifeguards have to spend far too much time enforcing the "no diapers in the pool and lake rule". At our July board meeting the Board of Directors fully backed this rule.

TOP TEN WINTER SAFETY TIPS

More than half of all fatal house fires occur in the winter.

- 1. Keep heaters at least three feet away from bedding, furniture, and drapes.
- 2. Check the condition of electric heaters before use, especially if they've been stored away.
- 3. Check for cracks or tears in electric wiring, loose plugs and exposed wiring.
- 4. Install smoke detectors. Test them once a month. Remember to replace the batteries when you change your clocks twice a year.
- 5. Install carbon monoxide detectors. Carbon monoxide detectors, like smoke detectors have a life span of no more than ten years. The same applies to electric blankets as a rule. Replace them around every ten years.
- 6. Clean the lint trap in the dryer after each load. Don't allow a buildup of lint in the exhaust duct. Lint is flammable with enough accumulation and enough heat. Don't leave the house while the dryer is running.
- 7. Don't use light weight extension cords on "heavy" appliances. Don't allow permanent use of extension cords. Never run extension cords under carpets/rugs. Replace frayed extension cords.
- 8. Keep a multi-purpose fire extinguisher on all floors of the house. Keep it between you and the kitchen range, not beyond the range. Keep one near the heating system. Never attempt to extinguish a fire that spreads quickly. Close the door, leave the house and call the fire department.
- 9. Make sure the fireplace flue opens and closes fully. Have your chimney cleaned annually by a professional service. Keep flammable items three feet from the fireplace. Use a fireplace screen. Place all ashes in a metal container.
- 10. Plan a home fire drill. Know how to get out by TWO exit routes.




