FIREWISE AND ENVIRONMENTAL

Owners who attended the spring meeting heard an interesting discussion about geese and the problems that they can cause. Goose droppings can foul lawns and waterways. Several owners asked that the association take some action to deal with this problem. We have an ad hoc committee working on the issue and while awaiting their report we offer the following information. Geese love grass! They especially love grass next to the water! The association has adopted several rules to help with this problem: The association has a rule that requires a buffer of native grasses between any fine lawns and the lake. That rule went into effect last year. A recent tour of the lake shows that several owners have not complied and as a result, they have geese on their lawns. We also have a rule that prohibits feeding the geese. Please make sure that no one feeds the geese. We do not want to make them too comfortable at our lovely lake. If you have renters, please make sure they are aware of this rule.

There is an easy and inexpensive alternative for lakefront owners to help with this problem. Geese need an escape route when feeding. They like unobstructed access from the lawn to the water. A simple string of fishing line will stop them from feeding on the grass. Simply install a row of stakes along the water's edge and string monofilament about 12 inches above the ground. We suggest putting some flags on the line so that you and your guests see it. This is inexpensive and easily repaired should it break. It is also fairly unobtrusive.

We will keep you informed of further information on this problem. Please try the above ideas and let us know about your success.

LAKE/DAM COMMITTEE

Here we are in the midst of another beautiful summer in Bear Creek Lakes. From what I have been hearing and seeing, the fishing has been great! The rain has been plentiful and churned a nice turnover of fresh water in the lake which always helps the spawning cycles. As I type this report on the Summer Solstice, I anticipate a great summer season on the lake.

I would like to reiterate and offer some additional insight on an issue that was brought up at the Memorial Day meeting; Waterfowl or specifically; the Canada Goose. The harsh reality is that the more open space, grassy area that you have, the more inviting it will be for the geese – for decades Golf course Superintendents have been fighting the Canada Goose with little or no success. The Goose is very fearful of the unknown and will not venture into an area of dense vegetation where they have no clear sightlines for predators. So when you open up a wooded lot and clear the natural vegetation and plant grass, you are inviting the goose to lunch. Talk to your local landscapers about sacrificing a little of your yard and planting a woody vegetated buffer to act as a deterrent. We as an association are giving it our best to deter the waterfowl from congregating on the public areas. We have not seen the geese as much as we have in previous years (I personally have not seen any goslings this year!) Please remember our "Do Not Feed the Waterfowl" Rule. I will remind everyone that, by law, we are required to test the water quality weekly at ANY public swimming area – thus far this year, we have had exceptionally great water quality results!

While on the subject of boating, we have yet to see the PA Fish & Boat Commission conservation officer...but I would expect to. Random, unannounced visits to the lake are normal and they will give citations to any infractions of the State's rules and regulations. Please pick up a copy of the PA Safe Boating and Fishing book at any boating or tackle shop. OR visit, www.fishandboat.com.

This fall we will be installing bulkheads at both beaches to help with retention of upland soil, sand & sediment control. We will allow for a small ramp area in the center of both beaches that will effectively remain as a gentle slope for youngsters (and adults) to walk into the lake unobstructed. The type of bulkhead that we approved is a large precast manmade sandstone block that will blend into the existing environment quite nicely. The degree of lift on the bulkhead will be approximately 8" from the water and will provide the necessary "holding" of the beach sand.

In some preliminary conversations with the Road Committee, we are looking into repaying the boat ramp area as its current condition is deteriorating. If that becomes a reality, we may wait until early spring to do the paying as to not disrupt the use of the facility.

There seems to be an increase of an invasive reed (phragmites) that has been found in several spots along the shoreline of the lake. If left unchecked it can spread rapidly and really choke up the shoreline. I have had some preliminary conversations with our Aquatic Biologist on measures we can take to control the spreading of the reed. Stay tuned for further information.

The Dam is in fine shape and I don't anticipate any unusual observations from our engineer for this fall's annual inspection. Please remember that the dam is off limits and there is no trespassing allowed.
