## TREASURER'S REPORT JOHN KLAIBER

We're most of the way through this fiscal year and so far things are looking good.

We did major pool repairs this spring, recoating the surface, leak repair and new pump. The repairs cost approximately \$40,000. This came from our capital replacement funds.

We have to get the inlet gate valve for the dam checked this fall. We have over \$40,000 set aside for the lake/dam repairs if needed.

The road paving project for the year was just completed. The approximate cost was \$72,000.

The roofs on both bath houses and the pool house need to be replaced. This is currently out for bid.

I'm working on the new budget for next year. No other new projects as of yet.

I hope everybody is enjoying the HOT summer.

### **New Boating Rule**

Effective immediately, the entire lake has been defined as a "slow-no-wake" zone. That means a maximum speed of 5 mph. Prior to this rule change a large portion of the lake was already subject to "slow-no-wake (maximum of 5 mph) under PA Fish and Boat Commission regulations. The rule change covering the remaining part of the lake was made for the safety of all users of the lake. Penalties for violations will be the same as other Boating and Fishing fines - 1st offense -\$50 plus costs, 2nd and subsequent offenses - \$100 plus costs. Boating safely protects everyone using the lake.

### LAKE/DAM COMMITTEE

The lake has been very active this summer. What a beautiful sight seeing the sailboats skimming the lake on those hot days this summer. There have been so many new colorful sails! The lake has been filled with fun - swimmers, people fishing, boats and water toys too numerous to mention.

In June, the lake was treated for aquatic vegetation and was deemed to be a healthy lake by the firm treating it. We have hired a local engineering firm to conduct the 2012 annual dam inspection. This year the state is requiring us to include an end to end video inspection of the outlet structure, so don't be surprised if you see divers in the lake by the dam.

Please remember that all boaters are required to follow the rules of the Pennsylvania Fish & Boat Commission. All individuals fishing are subject to the Pennsylvania State Fishing Laws and Regulations. I want to remind everyone of a few additional rules here at BCL. These rules apply not only to the members of BCL but to all renters and guests of our community.

Live bait, including minnows, suckers, goldfish, carps, eel, darters, killifishes, chubs, and stone catfish are prohibited in the lake. Fishing is not permitted from the breast of the dam or near any swimming areas. BCL limits the number of fish kept to four fish within a 24 hour period.

All boats must stay 50 feet clear of marked swimming areas. Any use of the lake is to be at the risk of the owner of the boat. BCLCA shall not be liable for damage or injury resulting from submerged objects or collisions. Homeowners (not renters or guests) are the only individuals allowed to register their boats. Only registered boats are allowed on the lake. This helps to control the spread of invasive aquatic plants in the lake.

Please refer to the BCLCA Rule Book for all the rules pertaining to fishing and boating.

The lake committee continues to meet on an on going basis to discuss issues regarding the lake. The goal of the committee is to ensure the lake continues as a multipurpose lake. A multi-purpose lake is defined as

a lake used for boating, fishing, swimming, and an asset of the community.

### **BUILDING COMMITTEE**



The edges of the parking area were given a straight edge and backed up with stone for support. Our contractor Papillion and Moyer provided BCL with excellent service with minimum inconvenience.

### **MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE**



shelter for feral cats.

We have received input from a Wildlife Conservation Officer and a Veterinarian, both of whom highly discourage the feeding and sheltering of feral cats or any other wild animal.

Although feeding/sheltering without providing essential medical care such as rabies shots and neutering is done with good intentions and kindness, it is actually doing the animals a disservice and adding to the growing problem. You are essentially converting food into more cats! It is also a health risk to fellow members, should they be scratched or bitten by an untreated animal.

The pilot program approved by the board is an attempt to humanely deal with the existing population of animals in BCL, but it is by no means a long term solution.

If you choose to feed and or shelter stray cats, you should treat it as an adoption and make sure that you provide them with the proper care that you would provide for any other pet. If you are not willing to do this then please do not leave food out for them or provide support in any manner.

### HAPPY AND SAFE BOATING

One of the many things that I love about our community is the fact that you are all very friendly people! We wave at each other whether we are walking, biking, golf carting, driving or boating. We stop and chat and we look out for each other. To me this is the very essence of community and I love it!

I have been out in my sailboat enjoying the breezy weather on our beautiful lake and have observed and

participated in a few incidents that prompted me to write this piece. I love being on the water and I enjoy seeing everyone enjoying the lake. We have some busy times with swimmers and all types of boats crossing back and forth. It is great fun, but also poses a potential for harm.

I went to the State web site to brush up on the "Rules of the Road" and offer this summary.

- 1. All boaters must maintain a lookout at all times sounds like common sense, but even if you are distracted for a minute, a pontoon boat at full throttle can travel a long way.
- 2. Swimmers have right of way we have many fit residents and children who can and do swim across the lake. Keep a careful eye out for them. Swimmers, please remember that you can be hard to see as well. If you notice a boat getting close, splash and make sure they see you. I was sailing on a sunny afternoon and the reflection off of the waves did a great job of hiding a swimmer.
- 3. Boats under power must yield to boats not under power yes, this is the law of the lake! I have had several occasions when I have had to veer from my course to avoid a pontoon boat that cut right across my bow. I have seen other sailors and kayakers experience the same thing. It is usually very easy for a powered boat to simply increase or decrease speed to avoid a sail or other boat. If you are on a collision course with another boat, it is your duty to make a clear and early course change to avoid a close call.
- 4. Boats being rowed or paddled have right of way over sailboats. Same idea as above. Let us give each other a wide berth on the lake and keep everyone safe.



5. Always keep a look out for any one on the water who could be in distress. Even in our small lake, a sudden wind can flip a sailboat or break a mast. Kayaks or canoes can flip. Let us all keep an eye out for our neighbors on the water as well.

The lifeguards are great and are finishing another season including a mid-lake rescue drill. Let us all do everything we can to make sure that this drill is never needed.

### JRA 5K WALK/RUN OR 3K WALK-THANK YOU






