The State is requiring us to do an inspection of the lake/dam inlet valve. We need divers to take pictures and we might need to do repairs.

MEMBERSHIP SERVICES COMMITTEE

The Membership Services Committee was created in October to have a more positive interaction between the membership and the Board of Director's. It includes Delinquent Accounts and works closely with the BCLCA Office. When the office receives a phone call or e-mail from a member that raises an issue it is forwarded to the Membership Services Committee. The office had some major changes including a new office manager and a new computer system. The old computer system failed in July and could not have occurred at a worse time since our fiscal year ends in August. Many hours were spent in generating the September Dues Notification letters. Thanks to all the volunteers that helped in verifying the membership data and stuffing the 850 plus envelopes. We included a Member Registration Form to have accurate information as we transition to QuickBooks. Please return this form so the office can reach you. I have found that many of the phone numbers we have on file are no longer in service. If the office doesn't have accurate contact information we cannot notify you when there is a problem or concern. Contact the office, download the form from our web site or see the last page of this newsletter to update your information.

Delinguent Accounts: Three notification letters are mailed; one to all members in September identifying Dues and Road Fees approved at the Fall General Membership meeting. one in December to members that have not paid informing them their payment is late and one in January to members with an unpaid balance informing them legal actions will start in 30 days. Please note that the BCLCA Board of Director's prefers to avoid pursuing legal actions and public embarrassment to our members. However, the board does have a fiduciary responsibility to the entire membership and is required to pursue the collection of dues, road fees and assessments. If you are suffering a financial hardship please contact the BCLCA office and make arrangements for a payment plan. Any member with an unpaid balance that does not have a signed payment plan will receive a legal notice. These members will accrue additional costs for attorney fees and legal actions.

COMPUTER TECHNOLOGIES COMMITTEE

RECREATION COMMITTEE





LAKE/DAM COMMITTEE

From the lake's perspective, this had to be one of the mildest winters in a long time. With minimal ice, there was very little skating, hockey, or ice fishing.

The annual inspection of the dam found no significant issues. However, the state has notified us that by the end of 2012 we must have the outlet structure of the dam thoroughly inspected. This will require hiring divers who have special video equipment to perform the inspection.

New stone bulkheads were successfully installed at both beaches to help with sand and sediment control. The bulkhead creates approximately an eight inch drop at the water's edge. The center of each beach is open to allow for easy access to the lake.

Additional fish cribs were placed in the lake last fall, with the help of BCL volunteers and local boy scouts. They are often placed in lakes that don't have a lot of natural cover for fish to hide or spawn. Good news for our fisherman – the lake was stocked with 140 (8 to 10 inch) large mouth bass in October 2011.

When using chemicals for lawns and shrubbery anywhere in the community, it's important to remember that those chemicals will ultimately end up in our drinking water and in the lake. Whenever possible, residents are encouraged to use organic/natural solutions. As always, please read the directions carefully.

A reminder to BCL boaters, the lake is subject to inspections by the PA Fish & Boat Commission conservation officer. The officer will give citations for any infractions of the state's rules and regulations. At a minimum, the state requires that all children 12 and under must wear a life jacket when in a boat and there must be life jackets available for all other occupants of the boat. Copies of the PA Safe Boating and Fishing book are available at http://fishandboat.com/bookboat.htm and bait and tackle shops.

While it's extremely difficult to eliminate the Canada Geese issue, it's important to remember our "Do not feed the waterfowl" rule. This rule applies not only to geese, but the ducks, swans, and all other waterfowl. There has been some success in keeping the geese off lawns by keeping a natural barrier along the water's edge. Stop mowing along the edge of the lake and allow a natural strip of vegetation to fill in. Without clear sightlines, the geese will often go elsewhere.

As we head into the boating and fishing season, remember that all boats must have valid BCL stickers and members and guests must wear their BCL badges. Help us keep the lake safe for all of us at Bear Creek Lakes.

Another winter has come and gone. Although one of the milder ones, I am not sad to see it go.

I personally prefer the blustery, snowy winters. At the time I am writing this update, there are many signs of Spring. The robins have returned, there are buds on some of the trees and the road kill numbers on Route 903 are climbing. I wish you all a wonderful summer season!

Here are some of the things the Environmental Committee has been up to since the last newsletter:

Tree Sapling Giveaway

In past years, we have given away tree saplings at our Spring General Meeting. We are looking to do this again this year. At this time it looks like we will only be able to get Norway Spruces. Hardwoods are not available this year from the DCNR Nursery.

Spring Cleanup

We have been looking into partnering with local boy scouts to perform a mass litter cleanup of Bear Creek Lakes in the spirit of Earth Day. This will provide a mutual benefit of a cleaner community for us and community service points for the scouts. Hopefully this will come to fruition and you will see the results.

Feral Cat Management

Last fall, the Board was made aware of a growing feral cat population, predominately in the Mountain View section of our community. These animals are typically a result of pet owners abandoning their unwanted cats in our area, allowing them to reproduce freely.

The Board voted to provide funding for a pilot management program. The program involves trapping/neutering/and releasing the animals and is being coordinated by the Environmental Committee.


In order to make this program a success, volunteers are needed to provide feeding stations for the cats and then with expert assistance, trap the cats. Additional volunteers are needed to transport them to and from the veterinary clinics. The Board will reimburse expenses incurred for the veterinary procedures until the initial allocated amount has been disbursed, at which time we will evaluate the effectiveness of the program. We are also looking into grants to help subsidize the costs.

We currently have only one family participating in the program. They have been doing a great job, but, can certainly use our help.

Check your chimney to see that it is clear and has a screen in place.

Our esteemed president has asked me to begin our long range plan by conducting an evaluation of our existing relationships and systems. We will look at many facets of the association's operations to evaluate the economy and effectiveness of our efforts. We will look at the ROADS expenditures, Lake dredging, Dam repairs, Pool restoration/replacement and the Stewart Hall capital needs as part of this evaluation. RULES COMMITTEE

Every community flourishes when members agree on a code of conduct, especially a community led by an association of property owners. The Bear Creek Lake Civic Association is guided by such a code to maintain and advance the social and civic interests of our property owners. From time to time it becomes necessary to alter details in our rules or introduce new ones to adapt to changing conditions.

When the BCLCA adopts a new rule, changes need to

be communicated as soon and as completely as possible. Therefore, the BCLCA will display rule changes on the community website as they are enacted as well as issue written copies at the Memorial Day general meeting. Please file any changes with your family copy of the BCLCA Rule Book.

This past year the following rules have been adopted, changes noted by underline:

Vehicle Identification, page 11, #2: Renters and visitors must display a visitor's pass when parking at any Bear Creek Lakes community facility. Visitor passes must be provided by the homeowner. Replacing a visitor's parking pass will cost \$50.

Tree Preservation Rule, page 30, #6: Existing house lot owners who want to remove trees for any purpose, including those dead or dangerous, shall submit a tree-removal application showing trees to be removed. The association may at its option require replacement of trees removed at other locations on the lot upon mutual agreement as to location.

General Rules, Regulation and Information, page 8, #9: Pursuant to the By-Laws of the Bear Creek Lakes Civic Association (BCLCA) every member must pay dues. In addition, a road assessment must be paid for each lot. All assessments must be paid in accordance with the schedule established by the Board and assessments that are not paid in accordance with the payment schedule will be subject to late fees, cost of collection including legal fees, and shall accrue interest at the legal maximum rate permitted by Act 180.

A CHANCE ENCOUNTER-

Let this serve as a reminder that we are living in harmony with the wildlife that surrounds our community.

Last week during my normal routine of a morning walk with my 25lb dog Charlie, I encountered what we have all but confirmed as two Coyotes. I was walking along the east side of the lake near the intersection of Piney Woods and BCL Drive, just a bit before daybreak (appx. 6:20am).

The incident lasted all but 30-40 seconds. I saw the two dark silhouettes in the distance about 30 yards away on the shoulder of the road. As I moved a few steps closer I realized it was two canines and they started to move towards us. I screamed incessantly and managed to only scare one away - the trailing one which was more than likely the female. To my surprise, the one in the lead kept moving towards us and did engage in a skirmish with Charlie. I managed to hit that one with my retractable leash handle and knock him off Charlie. It then attempted to lunge a second time but my loud scream scared it off this time. Charlie was not injured and I have to admit, he held his own during the encounter.

I initially thought that what I encountered were two smaller German Shepherd type dogs. After talking with Jack Zapolla, our Security Guard, we both ascertained that neither of us had seen any loose dogs fitting that description in the vicinity - or BCL in general. After discussing the incident with several people, it was thought that maybe I encountered Coyotes and not Dogs. I then contacted the PA Game Commission and spoke with the Conservation Officer who presides over our region. After recanting the story to him, he was just about 100% convinced (if not 100%) that I had indeed encountered a mating pair of Coyotes. On the day of the incident, there was an unusual amount of migratory waterfowl noise coming off the lake and the Coyotes were perhaps in prey mode trying to grab a duck or goose. Waterfowl, or birds in general, are not the primary choice of prey for Coyotes, but the situation may have been ideal for them. I just happened to be in the wrong place at the wrong time.

The Game Commission Officer did tell me that Coyotes are rather abundant in our area and are rarely a threat to people. He did tell me that he has a network of hunters that he will put on notice regarding my encounter. If possible, they will use my information as a reason to hunt in our area, but ONLY in the approved Game Lands and Weiser State Forest (closer to the east side of the lake). Coyotes are "open season" – year round with a small exception I believe in and around deer season--don't quote me.

Let this be a reminder that we are living in an extremely forested area and there is an abundant amount of Wildlife in our region. If you are going to walk in the early hours of the morning, carry a walking stick and, if possible, pepper spray. And I cannot stress this enough; ALWAYS WALK YOUR DOG ON A LEASH...the Game Commission Officer said that probably saved Charlie from a more severe consequence.

Editor's note – Let's not forget all the wildlife we may encounter such as Black Bear, Foxes, Mountain Lion and of course our Deer & Turkeys....



PennFuture Facts: A Bug's Life

If you — or your animal companions — have been frolicking outside, you may have already noticed this problem. Bugs. Lots of them. Ticks. Ants. Termites. Ladybugs. Even mosquitoes. Thanks to our mild winter, they're out and about — and hungry. According to researchers, not only are the insects coming weeks earlier than usual, there are more insects out than before, because the lack of cold weather means the usual kill off of larvae simply didn't happen.

This is bad news for Pennsylvanians who enjoy outdoors recreation, because these bugs carry Lyme disease and other warmer weather illnesses that are now settling in for good in our region. And for farmers, these early ravenous insect swarms could spell disaster as crops are stripped just as they begin to grow.

Bees — already under attack by a mysterious parasite — are changing their behavior, too. With the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration reporting that "warmer-than-average temperatures were widespread across the 48 contiguous states during January," bees hibernated less and were more active. That means they ate their winter stores, and there are too few flowers out to provide the nectar they now need. When food shortages hit, hives often respond by slowing egg production, which means fewer bees to both pollinate the crops and store honey for the winter. And if the globe faces the same drought/flood conditions that have been occurring, the situation will get even worse.

When Thunder Roars, Go Indoors!

Lightning Safety Week: June 24-30. Your family plans to go to the beach or pool today. The weather forecast calls for a nice morning but chance

of afternoon thunderstorms. Early afternoon you notice the skies darkening. Next, you here the Lifeguards instructing everyone to get out of the water. Just because you don't hear the thunder does not mean it does not exist. Our beaches tend to be quieter; especially North Beach and the guards at the beaches are alert for the sound of thunder and to report to all the other guards via their radios.

THIS IS THEIR JOB, to protect you and your family. Please, for your own benefit, clear the water as quickly as possible when asked by our lifequards.

RADON

Radon is a colorless, odorless, radioactive gas that occurs naturally through the breakdown of uranium in soil and rocks. It can seep into homes through cracks in basements and foundations, and can build up inside to concentrations many times the recommended level.

Radon is responsible for an estimated 20,000 lung cancer deaths every year, according to Environmental Protection Agency, and about 40 percent of Pennsylvania homes have radon levels above the EPA action level. While radon problems may be more common in some regions, there is potential for any home to have high radon levels.
