- \$6.300 for a DEP-mandated surety bond for the dam.

- \$3,048 for fish stocking (covered by donations)

Our annual audit for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2015 has been completed with no issues. MAINTENANCE AND ROADS

This past winter was calm in BCL. Our road crew plowed 4 times as compared to the winter of 2014-2015 when the roads were plowed 33 times.

In September, we hired John McMenaman to assist our Maintenance Supervisor Jim Halpin. These 2 gentlemen take care of our facilities, our roads and the grounds. It is a large undertaking, they wear many hats; but do an excellent job as they are committed to keeping BCL pristine as they strive to complete their duties throughout the year. Spring cleanup has begun; they are getting cinders off roads, repairing facilities, prepping mowers and making ready the pool and beaches for the

coming summer season.

RULES

Three changes have been made to our rules since last reported:

- The bond requirements for houses and garages have been reduced
- Stickers will now be required for all boat trailers. For now, there will be no fines for failure to have a sticker, but the new rule will be enforced starting in 2017.
- If a Member is cited for failure to have a required sticker on a vehicle, the \$55 fine will be reduced to \$5 if the Member comes to the office, requests a sticker and demonstrates that the sticker has been attached to his vehicle.

I remind our members to be aware when open burning is banned in Penn Forest Township. Further, according to our rules, no burning of trash is permitted at any time. Recreation fires 3' in diameter or less are permitted, as long as you contact the COM center at 570-325-9111.

The Rule Book is being updated and will be



posted on the www.bclca.org website when completed.

LONG TERM PLANNING

As you know, we engaged the firm of DW Smith to prepare a study of reserve requirements for our community. Now that the DWS reserve study is complete we are now able to take that information and put it to work to take our community into the future. Part of the reserve study addresses major components of our community, their life cycles and future replacement/upgrade/maintenance of these components.

The Long Range Planning Committee now is working on taking this information and converting it into working manuals for each of these components. These manuals will assist us to keep information centralized and current.

The manuals will be used by the directors to:

- Keep an inventory of the assets under their supervision
- Maintain a maintenance log of the service work done
- Help assess the projected life cycle versus the actual life cycle of an asset to

stay within budgetary allocation

- Catalog the vendors used;
 - Contact information
 - Insurance
 - Contracts
 - o Bills
 - Warranties

These manuals will be useful tools for any director whether they are new to the position or a seasoned director. The manuals will cut the ramp up time of a new Director and in turn make them more productive.

Lake & Dam Committee Report

I. North Beach to re-open

I am happy to report that repairs to the soft bottom areas discovered at North Beach last season have been completed and North Beach is currently scheduled to re-open Memorial Day weekend.

II. Preventative Maintenance performed on dam spillway

Our annual state mandated dam/spillway inspection confirmed once again that our dam and spillway are in excellent condition. The engineering firm that performed the inspection did suggest that we take care of some surface cracking which had formed on the downstream side of the concrete spillway as a preventative measure. A contractor was hired and the



repairs were made in November.

III. Fisheries Management efforts

The fisheries management goal of the BCL board Lake/Dam and Environmental Committees is to manage the fish population in such a way as to maintain a healthy, balanced fishery that provides an enjoyable angling experience for all.

If you remember, in 2013 we engaged a lake management consulting firm to assess the health and species balance of our fish population. The specific outcome of this study was to evaluate each resident species regarding its growth rate, size range and reproductive potential and recommend a course of action for the future. The complete results of this study can be found on our BCL web. I would encourage all to read the report even if you are not a fisherman.

The study revealed a balanced fish population in Bear Creek Lake with the exception of one species. The study's report also included key recommendations for the future. We have been following those recommendations and have stocked Golden Shiners as an added forage (food) source for Bass. We have also stocked over 400 Large Mouth Bass in the 8-10 inch range to augment the existing population. The out of balance species I mentioned previously is the Yellow Perch, which was deemed to be over populated and as a result, stunted in size. The perch is not a preferred food source for the bass so a new predator species was recommended to control the perch population. To that end we have been stocking Walleye in the 5-8 inch range. Walleye are a natural predator of the perch, and have been used in other lakes in northeast Pennsylvania to manage stunted perch populations. Walleye generally feed from late evening to early morning so we would not be surprised to hear that not many are being caught by fisherman during the peak daytime hours. But again, these fish were stocked not so much to be caught as they were to manage the perch

and therefore help balance the lake ecosystem.

All of the stocking in the past two years has been paid for via private donations from members.

IV. Bathymetric Survey

A bathymetric survey of the lake will be performed this Spring to establish a depth baseline to monitor potential future depth reduction due to siltation. We are fortunate in that our lake is fed by underground springs and not surface water which is the major source of silt. We do however experience storm runoff entering our lake which carries silt so it is is imperative that we monitor depth changes. A depth profile map will be produced as output of this survey and will be available in the new Members Only partition of our web site.

V. Additional Paddle Craft launch areas

In an effort to relieve some of the traffic and parking issues at the boat launch and increase flexibility for our members, we are instituting a trial program this year to allow paddle craft (canoes/kayaks/stand-up paddle boards) to be launched from specific areas at North and South beaches. These areas will be clearly marked. The craft are to be carry-in only (no trailers) and should not be left unattended for long periods of time in the launch areas as a courtesy to other boaters and patrons of the beach. We will evaluate the program this fall and make a decision whether or not to make this permanent.

Due to safety concerns, launching of any water craft is *still prohibited at the Dam Spillway Park*.

VI. New Boat Dock

We are in the process of replacing the existing boat dock which has become structurally unsound.

VII. Lake Rangers

We are instituting a new volunteer force to patrol the lake. The role of the Lake Rangers will be to check for BCL Badges, BCL boat registration, adherence to BCL Fishing Rules and provide general assistance if needed. The Rangers can also be utilized to provide additional safety for BCL sponsored lake events such as Tubing on the Lake and Moonlight Kayaking. If you are interested in becoming a Lake Ranger, Please contact me through the BCL office.

VIII. Trailer registration now required

BCLCA registration stickers are now required for all state licensed trailers parked at the boat launch. Please stop by the office to register your trailer.

The beautiful natural landscape at BCL is in transition. Dave Lautt has designed all of our



key common areas (903 Entrance, Pool Drive triangle, etc.) similar to what he has done at the Indian Trail triangle. The design includes natural/native landscaping with maintenance free and deer proof plantings. The dead Holly & Boxwood bushes will be replaced and accentuated with Daffodils, Silver King, Pachysandra and Lecouthawee. We intend to carry out this design. The soil in all the key areas must be tilled with fresh loam and some top soil added and mulch where appropriate. This will ensure the long term health of all of our plantings.

Implementing this design will take a few years to complete due to the high cost of materials needed. All labor will be provided by volunteers and all professional landscaper assistance is greatly appreciated.

I believe this design, when complete, will look beautiful for years to come and be maintenance free.

Of course we will provide annual blooming flowers (Marigolds) for our pool and boat dock areas!!!

HEALTHY LAWNS- HEALTHY LAKE: CAN THEY CO-EXIST?

As spring arrives, many homeowners will begin to treat their lawns with fertilizer and herbicides. In our climate it is virtually impossible to maintain an attractive lawn without adding supplemental fertilizers. In many areas this is not as much of a problem as it is in BCLCA. Most of the chemicals that we utilize on our lawns winds up in our wells and lake. We encourage owners in our woodland community to consider more natural landscaping than fine turf lawns, however there are many steps that can be taken to maintain a lawn and minimize the negative effects. Lakefront owners are required to maintain and natural barrier such as tall native grasses or shrubs between lawn areas and the lake. This helps to minimize any runoff and also will discourage Geese from dining on your lawn and has the added benefit of minimizing the resulting goose pollution! Even though the lakefront owners are the first link in the chain, every owner in the community should be aware

The first rule and actually the law of the land is to read the label on every product before you buy or apply! Many lawn products cannot be applied within 100 feet of a waterway. (Personally, I consider my well the same as a waterway). Also when shopping for fertilizer

of the chemicals they are using.

please use low impact formulas and pay special attention to the phosphorus content. Lawns do not need phosphorus and it has a very negative impact on the lake. The use of "Roundup" and similar weed killers is also prohibited near the water. Last year I saw one of our owners spraying Roundup right along the lakeshore. I was too far away to have a chat with them; however they were not following the requirements for use. The University of Pittsburgh recently published a study showing that small quantities of Roundup wiped out the population of frogs, tadpoles and other amphibians in lab tests. I am unaware of any commercially produced weed killers that are approved for shoreline application. If any of you have found one please let me know and I will share the information. I have had good success with this homemade and cost effective recipe: 1 gallon household white vinegar, 2 cups Salt, 1/2 cup Dawn dish liquid. Mix well and spray in AM on a dry sunny day. This will kill any weeds and can be used near the shoreline.

Our lake is the crown jewel of our community and is intrinsic to the beauty and value of every home in BCLCA. Let's all work together to protect this gem.

ENVIRONMENTAL COMMITTEE

As we approach another summer season it is time to summarize several items that were left open ended in the Fall 2015 Newsletter.

Gypsy Moth Infestation: An investigation of the Commonwealth's planned 2016 spraying program disclosed several complications for a private community such as ours – not the least of which was the projected cost (due to very limited State funding). Secondly, the potential for creating a "checker board" plan in order to accommodate the wishes of non-participating property owners might disqualify us with respect to the State supported program. We will continue to monitor this issue both in terms of severity predictions for this year and state program participation requirements and cost.

North Beach Closure: The problematic section of lake floor soil reported in the Fall 2015 Newsletter was stabilized with river rock and the potential hazard eliminated. Please see the Lake and Dam Committee Report for additional confirmation of beach access.

New Business. Actually, there is nothing new about efforts to maintain our community, its appearance and environmental health and our quality of life as residents. The following issues have been reinforced for me by recent events and lead me to believe it is easy to lose track of some of the most important features of our community and the need to protect them.

Offsite run-on of storm water: Several times each year we experience major storm events that bring off-site rainfall onto the community – eroding properties on Dogwood and Willow Drives, damaging street berms and flooding yards along Larch Drive. This water, at times is potentially adding road and highway sourced pollutants to our lake as well as sediment. Since the source involves properties and activities beyond our community, the solution of the problem is complex. We intend to seek

Soil Conservation District support in an effort to confirm our neighbors are complying with conditions of any land development approvals (storm water management) that may impact us – and to also provide advice on improvements we might make within the neighborhood.

Neighborhood Appearance: Recently I shoveled up a pile of broken plastic and fiberglass (the remnants of a New Year's Eve incident on Hawthorne; and parts of a discarded tire and a Bissell sweeper on Lake. These were definitely unusual incidents, but they started me thinking about some things I routinely see along our streets that detract from our quality of life – and the property values of our homes. If we drink the water – or play in the lake - animal waste can have a health impact on us. If a realtor drives a prospective home owner down a street littered with drink containers and cigarette butts, we all may lose



something. While this may have a negative impact as great as the storm water issue, it has a much simpler solution: If each of us cleans up after our pets, refuses to ignore litter and to impress upon renters our feelings as owners about this (as well as to our own guests and family members) we can make a great improvement. Let's all try to set a good example.

6th ANNUAL ARTHRITIS 5k WALK/RUNDylan Bradley

Dylan's 6th Annual 5K Arthritis Walk/Run first began in 2011 to help in the fight against Juvenile Arthritis. NEWS FROM JIM THORPE'S DIMMICK MEMORIAL LIBRARY

Well, have you read the news? The Dimmick Memorial Library is in financial trouble.

The Dimmick Memorial Library was built in

1889 and opened in 1890. It was funded though a trust established by Milton Dimmick who lived in Mauch Chunk and who died in 1884. It is a lovely cross gabled building, ornamented with terra cotta panels and set back from the street. In 1970 a devastating fire destroyed much of the building, necessitating rebuilding a good deal of the interior. The basic features of the great hall reading room remain intact.

The library serves Jim Thorpe, Nesquehoning, Penn Forest and Kidder townships. Although most libraries are funded though a dedicated tax millage, this is not the case for the Dimmick. Voluntary contributions from the districts served are limited. And though the state library regulations are strict, the state's allotment to the Dimmick covers only about 16% of its operating costs. The library has been functioning on the principle of Milton's endowment.

The Friends of the Library has been very active over the years in supporting and supplementing library programs and raising funds to contribute to library expenses. We have particularly loved working our weekly book sales at the Friends House. Although we raise a significant amount of money through these sales, the cost of maintaining the beautiful old Victorian home is no longer affordable. So the house is being sold, and the Friends members will work on new ways of raising money for the library.

In the event that the weather becomes an issue as it did last year, we'll make every effort to reschedule. Any changes in the date will be made to the BCL online calendar, via bulletin board postings and on the Friends of BCL Facebook page.

BCL APPAREL

On June 8, 2015, I officially took over the responsibilities and privilege of handling the BCL Apparel orders. On that date, I inherited a stock of BCL sweatshirts and a handful of catalogs! Thanks to Edie Boyer's direction and advice, and the wonderful personal service I am afforded at Valley Athletic, I was able to jump right in. As with any new adventure, there is a learning curve. This first year has taught me much and presented opportunities to make changes and corrections along the way.

There is an outstanding balance of \$228.00 on the invoice for the original sweatshirt stock. Because I have seen a desire for a wider choice of color options, and turn-around time is only 2 weeks with no required minimum, I will not be holding sweatshirt stock in the future.

Embroidery orders for fleece have been the most popular. Excluding an outstanding order at this writing, we have taken in \$492.00 in orders, netting a profit of \$130.00.

While brainstorming alternative methods of fundraising within the scope of BCL apparel, I started to experiment with the idea of creating

unique t-shirt designs, intending to offer something new every year. During the Fall General meeting, I introduced my idea and it was received very favorably. In response to the many requests, comments and suggestions I received, I began taking pre-orders for a variety of shirt types and sizes, including Kids' short sleeve, Women's v-neck short sleeve, Men's short sleeve and Unisex long sleeve t-shirts. The cost of the original order exceeded the available budget, so my husband and I decided to self-fund the venture.

T-shirt sales have grossed \$1053.00 so far, but we are currently \$105.00 shy of breakeven. I'm certain that come summer, the remaining stock will sell out and we will be able to turn over the estimated profit of \$670.00 to the Board. In the future, launch of any new t-shirts will occur in the Spring/Summer to avoid stock retention and make sales and delivery more convenient for our community members.


