The Association's Aquatic Biologist uncovered a very invasive weed in the lake during his visit today - Water Chestnut:

Only one (1) plant was found near North Beach and it was very small and was removed! This plant has never been found in our lake before. The plant floats on the surface of the water. If found, the plant must be removed in it entirety, including the root ball and rosette. If you are out and about, please look for it and notify the association office immediately of it's location.

If you see water chestnut, pull it out and dispose of it far away from the water. Any plant destroyed will prevent up to 120 new plants from growing the next year!
